## ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

GENERAL ENTRANCE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Above average grades in secondary school or</li><li>• In HKDSE, a minimum Level 2 in 5 subjects, with at least 2 subjects at Level 3 or above*</li></ul>
ENGLISH LANGUAGE	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• A minimum of 61 TOEFL iBT or</li><li>• A minimum of 6.0 on the IELTS or</li><li>• A minimum 5.5 with 5.5 in each section</li></ul>

\*Projected HKDSE exam results may be used in the application review process. A provisional admission offer will be made with the expectation that the student will present results that meet the same level of academic performance projected in the application.

*Principal recommendation will be considered for admission.*
